APNC 2009 Fall Conference Course Descriptions

Plenary Session

Cultural Competency Includes Hip-Hop: Examining Youth Culture Michael Dublin MA, CSAPC, ICPS

Cultural Competency often instructs the field of addiction on the intricacies of ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation while missing an opportunity to address the cultural issues associated with youth immersed in Hop-Hop and popular youth culture. This session examines the history of hip hop culture, contemporary issue related to substance abuse and current evidence-based programs that must be considered when serving youth.

Introduction to Creative Expressive Arts Therapies

Sam Lewis Prevention Specialist, QP, MT

This education track will cover the different types of creative expressive arts therapies (ie. music therapy, art therapy, and dance therapy) and a brief historical background of each. Group expectations will be evaluated as well the venues of implementation. Assessment techniques on how to better know your audience with creative expressive arts will be learned as well as what are the goals and outcomes for specific groups. Practical Implementation examples will be presented during this session that will use hands on music and other creative expression techniques (ie. lyric analysis, rhythm activities, skills groups, music with movement, etc...) Examples of group processing will be covered to maintain resiliency of materials learned for therapeutic gain for population served

Who Heals the Healers? Self Care Issues for Professionals

Terri S. Cook, MA, LCAS, LPC, CCS

This is an interactive program to allow participants the opportunity to discuss self-care strategies and how quality of self care activities impact client care. Participants will examine their personal styles of work and begin to identify ways to care for self. Participants will also be given opportunity to identify professional stressors and practice utilization of a peer group support system in managing stress factors.

Services for Individuals with DWI Offenses

Steve Applegate, MEd., CSAC, Wayne D. Bailey, Dale Willetts, CCJP

This track will present an update for DWI Services providers including: development of online training and technical support for providers; updates on law or policy; how tos for DWLRs, and e508 system issues.

HIV/AIDS/Ethics Track

An Ethical Approach to Dealing with Infectious Disease in SA Counseling

Kathy Norins MEd

This workshop focus will be an ethical approach to dealing with HIV/AIDS, HCV, HPV, and other infectious disease in substance abuse counseling. Prevention, diagnosis, disclosure and treatment options will be addressed. Current research and effective prevention programs will be discussed. Participants will be encouraged to use this knowledge to become more effective in counseling the at risk populations we serve.

Participants may count 6 hrs. toward HIV/Bloodborne Pathogens requirements and 3 hrs. toward Ethics.

Prevention Track

Part 1 Gangs-Psychology and Interventions Participants will be provided with an overview of the gang mentality and likely causes of gang membership. Participants will learn about the developmental needs as they relate to gangs and what effective tools can be used to prevent, intervene and divert youth from gangs. Successful programming will be discussed with an emphasis on creative strategies useful to each participant and the area of NC in which they work. Therapeutic models important when working with this population will be highlighted.

Part 2 Facilitation Tips and Tricks Participants will have an opportunity to see and demonstrate the importance of positive and interactive group management techniques. It will include how icebreakers, goals, clear expectations and successful processing make the difference between "Why do I have to sit through another group?" and "I can't wait to come back again!" This interactive workshop is designed for prevention and other group facilitators of all ages.

Clinical Supervision/Ethics Track

Ethical Practice in the Provision of Clinical Supervision of Substance Abuse Services in NC's Rapidly Changing Clinical and Administrative Environment

L. Worth Bolton, MSW, LCAS, CCCS

Clinical Supervision in SA Services is challenged by increasing constraints imposed by managed care strategies imposed by UM/UR organizations. LCAS's are doing supervision in enhanced services, often without benefit of actual training as a Clinical Supervisor. This training will benefit any addiction professional wanting updated information and training on effective supervision strategies. *Participants may count 6 hrs toward Clinical Supervision requirements and 3 hrs. toward Ethics.*

Open 12-Step Meeting

Both 12-Step participants and those who are not members of the fellowship can experience a typical 12-Step Speaker meeting.

Plenary Session

Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient

Information Mark Botts, JD In North Carolina, substance abuse patient information is governed by three privacy laws: the HIPAA privacy rule, state confidentiality law, and the federal law governing substance abuse patient information (42 C.F.R. Part 2). The substance abuse law prohibits disclosure of patient information in many circumstances where HIPAA and state confidentiality law would otherwise permit disclosure. After attending this presentation, conference participants will know what information is protected by the substance abuse law, when disclosure is permitted or prohibited, and how to respond to requests for disclosure of patient information.

Conference Location

All rooms at the Courtyard Carolina Beach by Marriott are ocean front with private balconies and are equipped with mini-refrigerators and high-speed internet access. The hotel has both an indoor and outdoor swimming pool, whirlpool and exercise room, a full service restaurant, complementary parking, and is located directly on the beach adjacent to the Carolina Beach Board Walk and Business District. Directions from I-40 and points North and West of Wilmington: Drive East on I-40 until it ends in Wilmington and becomes College Road (NC 132) and then becomes Carolina Beach Road (US 421). Continue into Carolina Beach and turn left on Charlotte Ave. Drive time from the Raleigh area is about 2.5 hours.

Directions from the Charlotte area: Drive East on US 74 to Wilmington; cross the bridge and follow directions to Carolina Beach Road (US 421). Continue to Carolina Beach and turn left on Charlotte Ave. Drive time from the Charlotte area is about 4 hrs.
